Note that if more than 3 of the evaluation criteria are not observed the evaluator(s) must decide whether the test should be redone.

5)	Handler recognizes when dog alerts to human scent				
6)	Dog performs refind or alert as described by handler				
7)	Dog demonstrates ability to work under control				
8)	Handler and dog work effectively with persons accompanying them				
9)	Handler demonstrates ability to report clearly on map the following:				
	A) Area and/or routes covered				
	B) Estimated probability of detection for team				
	C) Location of alert				
	D) Wind direction and other factors pertinent to search				
	E) Location of any clues encountered
